Dear All,

This is a difficult time for everyone and we are continuing to work very hard to close gaps in pupil's learning while keeping our school community safe. We have recently had some wonderful messages of support from parents and families and we are truly grateful for these. Every member of the school community has a different experience of COVID-19 and everyone copes in different ways, please remember that school staff also have lives and loved ones outside of school and we are all doing our very best for the school and the wider community.

COVID-19 update

To protect the more vulnerable members of our school community we are asking parents to wear face coverings when dropping off or picking up child/ren.

Please be advised that families who car share could have to self-isolate if there is a positive case within their 'bubble'. All cases are assessed individually by Public Health England. If you report a positive case to us we also need to know about car sharing arrangements.

If you or anyone that you live with have cause to take a test, the whole family/'bubble' should isolate until the test result is received. Please do not send your child/ren to school.

Coronavirus Symptoms

If you have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19), get a test as soon as possible. Stay at home until you get the result and inform the school once the result is received.

Main symptoms

The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- **a high temperature** – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- **a new, continuous cough** – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- **a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste** – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Most people with coronavirus have at least 1 of these symptoms.

What to do if you have symptoms

If you have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus:

1. Get a test to check if you have coronavirus as soon as possible.
2. Stay at home and do not have visitors until you get your test result – only leave your home to have a test.

Anyone you live with, and anyone in your support bubble, must also stay at home until you get your result.

How long to self-isolate

If you have symptoms or have tested positive for coronavirus, you will usually need to self-isolate for at least 10 days.

You'll usually need to self-isolate for 14 days if:

- someone you live with has symptoms or tested positive
- someone in your support bubble has symptoms or tested positive
- you've been told to self-isolate by NHS Test and Trace

Christmas Presents and cards

While we are always incredibly grateful for the wonderful gifts you give us at Christmas, this year we want to suggest something different. As you know, due to the global pandemic we are minimising the number of items coming between home and school. 
