

Sandon JMI School Sport Premium 2017-2018

The PE and Sport Premium is an additional amount of money, provided by the Government, to develop school sport related activities across Primary and Secondary Schools. The amount of funding received by schools is based upon the number of primary age children the school has and is to encourage all pupils to take part in a healthy and active lifestyle.

This year, 2017-2018, our school received approximately £17,000 as part of the PE and Sports Premium.

The focus of spending must lead to long lasting impact that will live well beyond the Primary PE and Sport Premium funding. It is expected that schools will see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

- 1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity kick-starting healthy active lifestyles.
- 2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
- 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport.
