NHSSP 2012 Olympic Legacy Event



Yesterday Class 3 went on a trip to The Knights Templar School, Baldock. It was an Olympics/Paralympics legacy event and all the North Herts schools were there, (in total there were over 800 children). Mr Litchfield did a superb speech about the morning ahead. We took part in 8 sports including: ultimate Frisbee, dance, wheelchair basketball, sitting volleyball, sucker archery, handball, boccia and table tennis.

"I took part in sitting volleyball which was an extremely challenging sport, it included body strength and was brilliant for our core strength. Our team included me (Isabella), Molly, Lila, Bethan and Izzy. We had 12 games and we won 4 of them.

After going back to the hall, we watched the fashion walk and the dance show. It was the closing ceremony where lots of medals were handed out. Olivia and Scarlett got a medal for dance."

"On Wednesday, the whole class went to represent Sandon School at Knights Templar for the North Herts Olympic/Paralympic legacy event. There were 800 children from seventeen schools; all of them wore different t-shirts and represented different countries. We represented Peru. When we got there, the 17 schools had to fit in a massive hall. Five minutes later, Mr Litchfield (the head teacher of Knights Templar) welcomed us to the event. After that, we all went to our sports events: boccia, dance, handball, sitting volleyball, table tennis, wheelchair basketball, ultimate Frisbee and sucker archery.

The event I took part in was wheelchair basketball. The aim of it was to get as many points as you could. The back board was 2 points, the net was 1 point and through the net was 3 points. Our team was Lia, Charlie, Philippa and me. When you moved you had to push twice and then pass or bounce. You had to carry the ball on your lap, tucked under your chin to prevent people from snatching it.

At the end of the day, we all had to go back to the PE hall (it was the closing ceremony). At the start of the ceremony, the dancers did a dance (that they had been working on all day). After that, it was medal awarding. We didn't get any medals (apart from all the dancers) but we still thought we did good!" Written by Tom P.


